

Sharp Tool Safety

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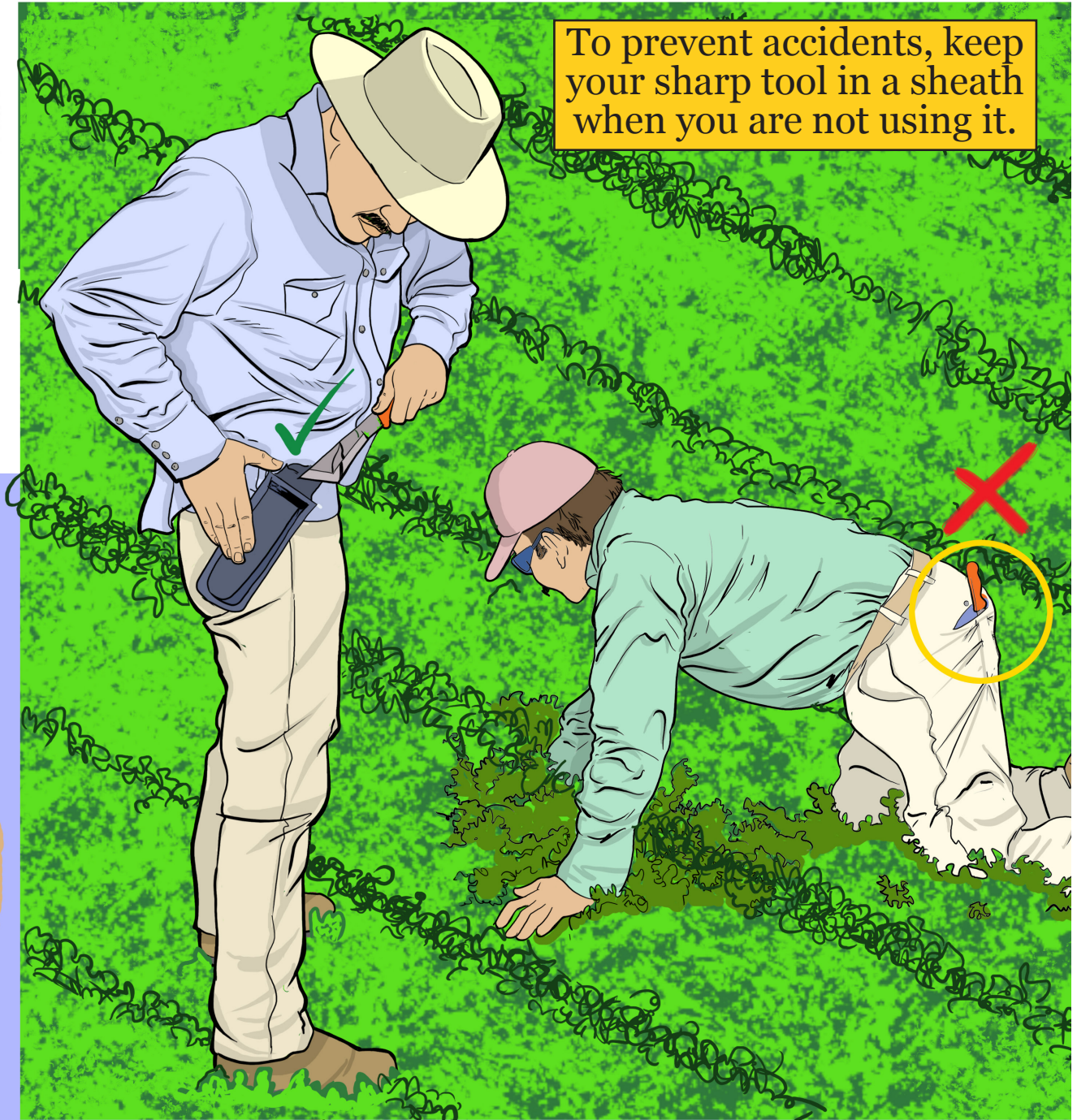


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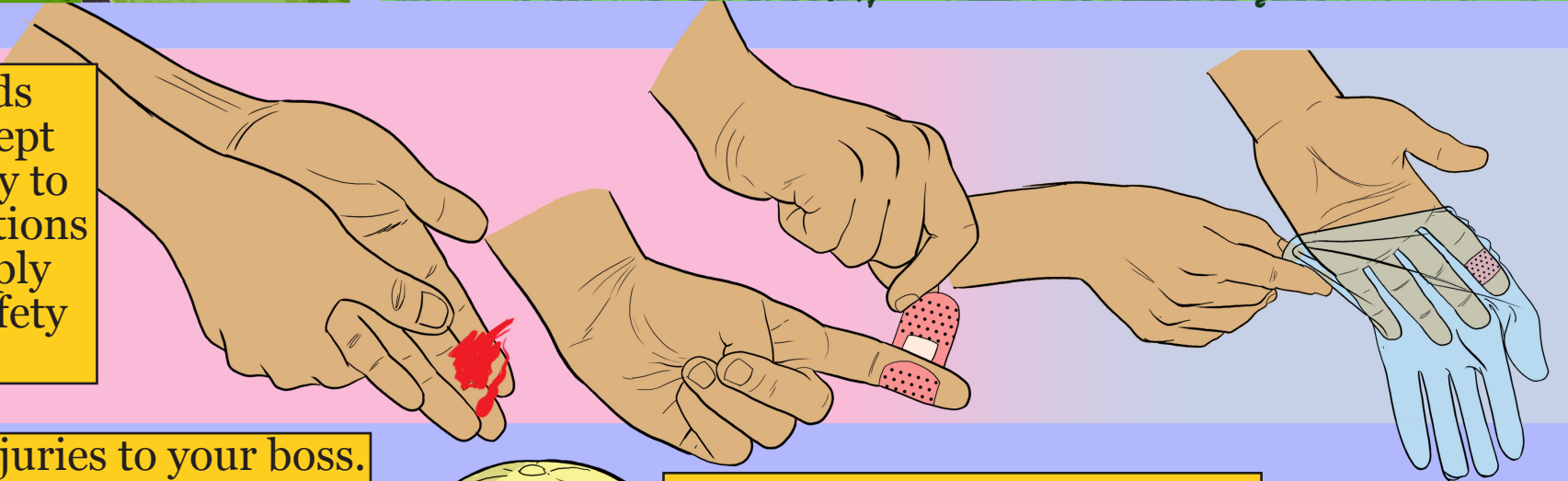
Tools that are kept clean and sharp are the safest.



To prevent accidents, keep your sharp tool in a sheath when you are not using it.



Any wounds should be kept clean and dry to prevent infections and to comply with food safety rules.



Report any injuries to your boss.

Also, inspect produce for blood and be sure to throw away any that may have been contaminated.

Clean and sanitize tools after any accidents.
