



Use of cartridge respirators is recommended for:








Before you work with pesticides or other chemicals:

To put on a cartridge respirator:








Replace the cartridges





5. Do a seal check! Cover the cartridges and inhalethe mask should collapse. Cover the valve and exhale- the mask should puff up gently. If you feel air escaping
